WHEREAS, In 1952, a bill, requiring the President to select a day for national prayer each year, which was later signed by President Truman, unanimously passed by both houses of congress proclaiming an annual National Day of Prayer (NDP); and

WHEREAS, In 1988, a bill was introduced to Congress which fixed the annual National Day of Prayer as the first Thursday in May and on May 5, 1988, the bill was signed into law by President Reagan; and

WHEREAS, The National Day of Prayer has great significance for us as a nation. It enables us to recall and to teach the way in which our founding fathers sought the wisdom of God when faced with critical decisions. It stands as a call to us to humbly come before God, seeking His guidance for our leaders and His grace upon us as a people; and






