Hidalgo County Elections Office mails out new voter registration certificates

EDINBURG – Hidalgo County residents should expect to see blue voter registration certificates in the mail this weekend or early next week. Hidalgo County Elections Administrator Yvonne Ramón announces that this year's voter registration certificates were mailed out in today's outgoing mail.

"On Friday, Dec. 4, the voter registration certificates were sent out and are the color blue," said Ramón. "This is a substantial change from the current orange certificates."

In the past, voters have received an orange voter registration certificate with their name and address, however this year residents need to keep an eye out for blue certificates. If they are registered voters and do not receive the new certificate in the mail by the end of next week they should contact the Hidalgo County Elections office at 956-318-2570 or stop their office, located at 101 S. 10th Ave. Edinburg, TX, to update their address.

Residents who wish to vote in the primary election on Tuesday, Mar. 1 must register with the elections office no later than Monday, Feb. 1, which is the last day to register to vote for the 2016 Primary Election.
